Standard 1: Students will be able to use a language other than English for communication. (Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing) Standard 2: Students will develop cross-cultural skills and understandings.

GRADING PRACTICES:

- Report card grades will be on a numeric scale as per NYSED reporting requirements, and the minimum grade allowable for a marking period is 50.
- Regents or other state assessment scale scores cannot be averaged into final grade. A final assessment that represents cumulative knowledge of course content (subject to approval by building principal) should count as 1/5 of the final grade. In the middle school and high school, a student has a two-week window to satisfy the incomplete as determined by a conference with the teacher. If the summative assignment is not complete at the end of the two-week period, the "I" converts to a 50. If the "I" is in place at the end of a credit-bearing course, the "I" will remain on record, and no credit will be given for the course.
- Any work submitted for a grade that has been plagiarized will be given a zero. Students <u>may not</u> use online translators or outside sources that are not cited. Additionally, students <u>may not</u> consult native or heritage speakers.

"Plagiarism includes reproducing someone else's work, whether it be a published article, chapter of a book, a paper from a friend or some file, or whatever. Plagiarism also includes the practice of employing or allowing another person to alter or revise the work which a student submits as his/her own, whoever that other person may be."
